This letter serves as the Department of Defense's (DoD) 2020 annual report as requested by section 2(c) of the Social Security Number Fraud Prevention Act of 2017 (Public Law 115-59). The Act requires the Department to submit a report, including a list of titles and identification numbers of documents containing an individual's complete Social Security number (SSN) that were mailed by the Department during the previous year, to Congress annually through September 15, 2022. In addition, the Act requires the Department to provide an update on the plan to comply with subsection (a) of the Act, which prohibits the inclusion of the SSN on a document sent by mail, unless the head of the agency determines it to be necessary, for any other report that is not the first or final report submitted. The following is the Department's update on the plan to comply with subsection (a) of the Act:

- The Department understands the importance of issuing rules concerning the use and management of SSNs in order to protect individual privacy. Department of Defense Instruction (DoDI) 1000.30, "Reduction of Social Security Number (SSN) Use Within DoD," has established that it is the policy of DoD that "all DoD personnel shall reduce or eliminate the use of SSNs wherever possible." This issuance already prohibits the use of an SSN unless authorized, but is being reviewed to ensure compliance with the Act, including restrictions on the inclusion of SSNs on forms. It will also address the protocol required of DoD personnel when handling the SSNs of the DoD workforce and those individuals affiliated with DoD.
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
- The Department is reviewing these reported mailings to ensure their continued utility to the DoD mission. In addition, the Department continues its efforts relating to the replacement of SSN with the DoD ID number where possible.

Enclosed is a list of documents identified by DoD Components in response to this year's data call to identify the title and identification number of any document containing the complete SSN of an individual transmitted via mail in Fiscal Year 2020.
